Open to IL residents of:

- Any age
- Any gender
- Individual income ≤\$3.754/mo
- People with private insurance
- No questions about citizenship or immigration for immediate, temporary FPPE coverage.

No cost:

- Annual check-up
- All birth control methods
- · STI care, HIV screening
- Gynecological care (pap, colpos)
- Preconception services
- PrEP (pill, shot + injection fee)
- PEP
- Mammograms
- Breast exams

To apply:

- Enroll in 12-months of coverage through ABE.
- Enroll in FPPE with designated providers.
- Access care, supplies, and meds at any health entity that accepts Medicaid.

Open to people 12+ of:

- Any immigration status
- Any state residency
- Any gender
- Household income ≤100% FPL for no-cost care, 101-250% for sliding fee discounted care

Low or no cost:

- All birth control methods
- · STI care, HIV screening
- Gynecological care (pap)
- Preconception services

To apply:

 Enroll in and access care, supplies, and meds with a Title X grantee clinic site.

Open to IL residents of:

- Any gender
- At risk for HIV and have a prescription for PrEP
- Any income

No cost:

- PrEP pill
- PrEP shot (with pre-approval; does not cover injection fee)

To apply:

 Complete an online application and submit requested documentation at prep4illinois.com.

Open to Illinois women:

- Ages 21-64
- Uninsured or underinsured

No cost:

- Mammograms
- Breast exam
- Gynecologic care (pap)

To apply:

- Enroll at an IBCCP agency
- Call the IDPH Women's Health Line (888-522-1282).

Clinics receiving 318 dollars for STI care should also assess patients for HFS FPP/FPPE eligibility to see if they can get STI care covered by Illinois Medicaid.
